WiDEF Technical Assistance (TA) Round Q&A

This document outlines responses to questions on WiDEF's current round of Technical Assistance which is open until September 12, 2024. The following questions were raised during the webinar(s) or were sent as inquiries to us over email. We have compiled all the questions and provided responses below. Some questions have been edited and/or modified to provide additional clarity. All questions were submitted by August 5, 2024.

#	Question	Answer
1	We would like to confirm if the technical assistance is exclusively available to large enterprises with over 249 employees, as mentioned in the application guidelines. Would organizations with fewer employees be immediately ineligible, even if they fit all other eligibility criteria? Alternatively, are there other opportunities for similar technical support from WIDEF for smaller/ growing private sector enterprises?	Yes, this particular round is only for large private sector enterprises that have 250 or more employees. However, enterprises with fewer employees may be eligible for other WiDEF rounds.
2	Is the stage of technical assistance a continuation of the first registration stage of the program and is it necessary to register for it?	No, this round is not a continuation of the other rounds. This is a separate round focused on providing technical assistance to large private sector enterprises Please visit our website for the latest updates.
3	Who/which providers provide the technical assistance to applicants for this round? Have the TA providers already been shortlisted by WIDEF? The RFP says third-party suppliers and members of the WIDEF consortium will provide TA. Does this mean that the applicant has no say in who can provide them with the TA?	The TA providers have not been selected yet. Technical assistance will be provided by third- party expert suppliers engaged by WiDEF. The details of the tailored TA to be provided will be defined in collaboration with the successful applicant and the TA provider will then be selected through an open request for proposal process. Successful applicants may suggest TA providers and will be consulted in the selection



		of the TA provider. However, the final decision for contracting will remain with WiDEF. Additionally, members of the WiDEF team will also provide additional technical assistance support. The TA to be provided by the WiDEF team will also be defined in collaboration with the applicant. No direct financial support will be provided to
		applicants as part of this WiDEF Technical Assistance round.
4	If there is a way at this time to be considered as a TA provider for this funding round, could you please provide specific instructions as to how to go about being considered applying?	The technical assistance supplier selection process will begin in December 2024 after the applicants have been selected. It will be done through an open request for proposal process. In the meantime, suppliers can send in their portfolio and contact details to us at contact@widef.global
5	Can the application be submitted in partnership with a preferred TA provider? a. How will WIDEF pay the TA provider? The RFP says- No direct financial support will be provided to applicants as part of this WiDEF funding round b. In case WIDEF pays the TA provider, what will be the arrangement? A grant or a service contract	The application should not be submitted in partnership with a preferred supplier. The details of the tailored TA to be provided will be defined in collaboration with the successful applicant and the TA provider will then be selected through an open request for proposal process. Shortlisted applicants will be able to suggest TA providers. However, the final decision for supplier selection and contracting will remain with WiDEF.
		contract. WIDEF will directly contract the TA provider.
6	Is there a way for TA providers to be a part of this WIDEF consortium?	TA providers are not being invited to be part of the consortium managing the delivery of WiDEF. The selection of TA providers who will deliver the TA support as part of this round will be done through an open request for proposal process. 7	We would appreciate having assistance to apply easily for the support you are providing.	Please note that we cannot offer any direct support during the application process. Please visit widef.global/funding and click on "apply



		now" which will take you to the application platform.

8	As we are operating two projects, we would like to know if we can be eligible to process both applications.	Only one application may be submitted per enterprise.
9	Regarding the request for applications for technical assistance for large private enterprises to tackle the gender divide, who would be considered eligible for this initiative and able to respond to the call? Although we are not a private company, we could leverage partnerships with our members to drive digital inclusion for women through meaningful access to and use of digital technology, particularly smartphones and the internet.	This round is open to large private sector enterprises with more than 249 employees and operating in one or more of the countries listed. The following organizations are not eligible to apply but can have partnerships with the large private sector enterprise applying and be named in the application as a partner (i) Governments, government-owned agencies (or appointed government agencies) (ii) UN Agencies and multilateral organizations (iii) Non-profits/NGOs (iv) Enterprises with fewer than 250 employees (MSMEs) (v) Universities or academic organizations, if it strengthens the value proposition of their applications.
10	My attempt to access round 2 questionnaire application form has not been successful, may you assist me get the same to tender my application?	We have put together a simplified user guide (see at the end of this document) to enable you to access the application form. 11	Is the women's organization filing its application or whether a company is going to file it?	This round is open to large private sector enterprises with more than 249 employees. They will submit the application. They can have partnerships with other organizations who can be named as a partner in the application.
12	Are NGO's eligible to apply? Is it eligible to have a consortium of only NGOs?	No. this round is for large private-sector enterprises with more than 249 employees. NGOs are not eligible to apply for this round, however, there will be other WiDEF funding rounds that NGOs could qualify for.



13	Can you please confirm if the regions for this window are Bangladesh / Africa & is there a separate application window for India?	For this round, eligible enterprises can have partnerships with NGOs when it strengthens the value proposition of their application. This technical assistance round is a global round and all countries where USAID operates are eligible, excluding Afghanistan, Burma, China, Cuba, Haiti, Jordan, Syria, Venezuela. This round includes India.

14	Can we in northwest Syria apply for the scholarship?	Enterprises in Syria are not eligible to apply. See the Request for Application document on our website for the list of eligible countries. Please note this round offers technical
		assistance to selected applicants rather than scholarships.
15	Can NGOs participate as part of the large firms that work with women?	NGOs are not eligible to apply for this round. However, NGOs will be other WiDEF funding rounds.
		For this round, eligible enterprises can have partnerships with NGOs when it strengthens the value proposition of their application.
16	Can you explain what do you mean by Gender Balance?	This technical assistance round focuses on solutions that address the gender digital divide and solutions must clearly explain how they will reach more women than men.
		The gender digital divide refers to the disproportionate exclusion of women and girls from the opportunities provided by digital connectivity. This includes how women and girls access, participate in, are empowered by, financially benefit from, and lead in the digital economy.
17	In this project, can beneficiaries be only women?	Not necessarily. However, proposals should clearly set out how they will reach more women than men since the focus of WiDEF is to reduce the gender digital divide.
18	Are universities eligible to apply	Universities are not eligible to apply for this round. For this round, eligible enterprises can have partnerships with universities when it strengthens the value proposition of their application.



19	Should the 250 employees be full time or can we include those that work on commission basis?	Applicants must have 250 or more full-time equivalent (FTE) employees. You may include commission-based/ seasonal or part-time workers and count the "full-time" units worked. For example, if 2 employees work half-time (ie 0.5 FTE units each), they could be counted as 1 full-time worker. Note: FTE is a way of adding up the hours of
		full-time, part-time and various other types of employees into measurable 'full-time' units.
20	When is the technical assistance round ought to begin	The timeline is as follows: The application window will close on 12 September, 11:59 PM BST. Selection will take place from September to December. Starting in December, successful applicants will be invited to the contracting stage with the GSMA Foundation. From January 2025 onwards, successful applicants will implement their projects with technical assistance from WiDEF.
21	Could you expand on what makes a solution "proven"?	A proven solution is where there is evidence that the solution can increase women's adoption or increased usage of the internet and internetenabled products and services, and help close the gender digital divide. Evidence can include, for instance, results from a pilot or evaluation showing traction of a product or service by women customers in your market or other markets.
22	Do we have to include the amount of technical support we need for our project?	Yes, as part of your application, please include details of technical assistance being requested (if you have an approximation of the technical assistance value this can also be provided). Please indicate: - What is the gap or challenge that technical assistance support from WiDEF can address? Why is this support needed? What does it unlock that would not be possible otherwise? - Describe the support you would ideally like from WiDEF. Which type of support and over what timelines?






Fluxx User Guide

Step 1: Access the application form from the Fluxx system. You will need to create an account by clicking the register button. Once you complete the process, you will receive an email to confirm your email address.




Step 2: Once you have confirmed your email, log in again. You will be directed to the landing portal shown below. On the left side, you will see the APPLY. Click this button to be redirected to the application page.






Step 3: On this page, you can begin your application by clicking begin application.




Step 4: Next, begin populating your application form by first completing the basic company information in one go. Then, submit it for the eligibility check. Please note that this section cannot be changed later.







Step 5: When completing the eligibility information, fill out all the required fields and submit everything at once, as you won't be able to go back and make changes. You can only continue your application if you meet the eligibility criteria. Please note that this initial "submit" button is only for the eligibility check, not for your actual application.



Step 6: Project section: First, read the Request for Applications document to prepare your answers with a rough word count. When you are ready, click the EDIT button (highlighted in a red circle). This will open up the text boxes shown in the second screenshot, where you can type in your responses. Remember to save your progress as you go along. You can save, close, and finalize your application later.







Step 7: When your application is completed and checked you can proceed to submit.
